WHAT IS FLYING HORSE FARMS?

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR FAMILY CAMP AT FLYING HORSE FARMS?

We love families at Flying Horse Farms. Any child age 7-15 who has a diagnosis within the areas of Cardiology, Hematology, Oncology, Rheumatology, Gastrointestinal Disorders, Kidney Disorders, Pulmonary Disorders and Craniofacial Anomalies is welcome to join us for a camp session, along with their family members. Moms, dads, grandparents, guardians, aunts, uncles, cousins, and siblings are all regular guests at family camps, and we've had anywhere from one to ten family members spend a weekend at camp with their camper. If you have a question regarding a family member or diagnosis group, give us a call!

CAN SIBLINGS AND OTHER FAMILY MEMBERS PARTICIPATE IN FAMILY CAMP?

Immediate family members and anyone in the camper's household are welcome to join us for s'mores, campfires, and lots of fun.

DO YOU PROVIDE CHILD CARE FOR YOUNGER SIBLINGS?

There's something for everyone at Flying Horse Farms. Your family will be assigned a counselor who will be happy to go to archery with your child while you relax by the fireplace or at yoga. While childcare is not specifically provided, our counselors will make sure that everyone is having a blast.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST FOR MY FAMILY TO ATTEND FLYING HORSE FARMS?

There is no cost to attend camp sessions at Flying Horse Farms. Lodging and meals are provided.

HOW WILL I KNOW WHEN MY FAMILY HAS BEEN ACCEPTED FOR A FAMILY CAMP WEEKEND?

After our medical staff looks over the applications and approves them, we'll send you a confirmation packet via e-mail. It will include the date of your camp session, and there may be some forms for you to send back to us or bring with you to camp. The packet will also include a packing list, driving directions, and other important information.

DO YOU PROVIDE TRANSPORTATION?

Unfortunately, no. If you are having difficulty arranging transportation, though, we'll do our best to help you arrange other options. Our Admissions Coordinator is the contact for transportation questions.

WHAT TIME SHOULD WE ARRIVE ON THE FIRST DAY OF CAMP? AND WHAT TIME WILL WE DEPART?

Arrival time is 6:00pm on the Friday of the family camp weekend. Families usually depart by noon on Sunday. If you need to arrive later or depart earlier, contact our Admissions Coordinator to make arrangements.

WHERE WILL MY FAMILY BE STAYING?

The camp experience wouldn't be the same without cabins! Typically, two families will share a cabin, but there is plenty of room for everyone. With two bathrooms (2 toilets and 2 fully accessible showers in each), heating, air conditioning, electrical outlets, and bunk-style beds, our cabin accommodations are comfortable yet modest. We provide all linens, blankets, and towels, too.

WHAT DO WE NEED TO BRING TO CAMP?

Food, bedding, and linens are all provided by Flying Horse Farms. You should bring all clothing, toiletries, and medical supplies with you to camp. Cameras, props, and costumes are also welcome!

WE WANT CAMP TO BE A SAFE EXPERIENCE FOR EVERYONE. PLEASE FOLLOW OUR DRESS CODE:

- Always wear closed-toe shoes or open-toe shoes with a heel strap (but you can bring your flip flops for the pool and inside the cabins)
- Make sure your shorts are below your fingertips or just above your knees (at least)
- Feel free to wear tank tops, but please leave the tube tops and spaghetti straps at home
- All clothing must cover your stomach/midriff
- Keep necklines of shirts appropriate
- Clothing and any visible tattoos that reference drugs/alcohol/obscenities/anything offensive are not allowed.

After arrival at 6:00pm on Friday, you'll have a buffet-style dinner, a large group activity, and then an opening campfire. The rest of the weekend is filled with countless activities for you to enjoy as a family, in pairs, or even alone. Archery, Arts and Crafts, Fishing, Canoeing, and many more activities will keep you busy during the day with large group activities and stage night performances in the evening. On Sunday, you can choose to sleep in or wake up early for an activity, followed by a delicious brunch and departure.

5:30 pm - Dinner
7:00 pm - Evening program
9:00 pm - Younger campers head back to the cabins for lights out
10:00 pm - Older campers head back to the cabins for lights out
