



Job Title: Unit Leader

Function/Team: Logistics

Position Overview:

The Unit Leader will provide supervision for campers, volunteers and staff, ensuring a safe, happy and memorable camp experience. Unit Leaders will be responsible for one camper village (youth, middle, teen) based on experience.

Function/Team Overview:

The Logistics Team makes camp a reality through the recruitment, admissions and support of campers, families, volunteers and seasonal staff members; they develop and deliver accessible, transformative and developmentally-appropriate camp programs in a safe and supportive environment.

Duties & Responsibilities:

- Oversee the Village operations of 2-4 cabins, each housing up to 10 campers.
- Attend daily morning Medical meetings. Coordinate with cabin staff on camper care needs. Collaborate with the PsychoSocial and cabin staff to address camper behavior concerns.
- Support, lead and evaluate cabin staff and volunteers.
- Observe camper behavior and assess its appropriateness, enforce appropriate safety regulations and emergency procedures and provide suitable behavior support techniques.
- Collaborate with Staff Leader to plan and implement staff appreciation initiatives and events

Key Requirements:

- Ability to provide professional, empathetic and caring communication with campers and families.
- Demonstrate problem-solving and conflict resolution skills with children and adults.
- Ability to motivate individuals and groups of peers and children.

General Requirements for all FHF Seasonal Employees:

- Attend seasonal leadership training (June 6-15, 2017).
- Know and adhere to the policies and procedures described in the FHF Seasonal Staff Manual.
- Embody the camp culture, mission and core values.
- Maintain a professional demeanor and positive working relationship with staff members, volunteers, and families.
- Attend all required trainings and staff meetings.
- Perform any other duties as assigned.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Peer Leadership experience.
- At least 1 season of summer residential camp experience.
- Valid First Aid and CPR Certification (strongly recommended)
